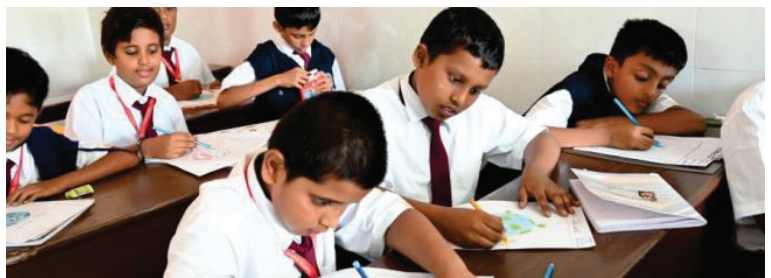
## House gardening-Std 10<sup>th</sup>

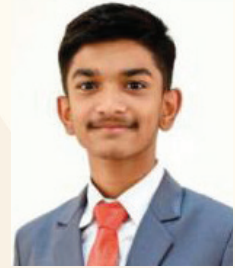

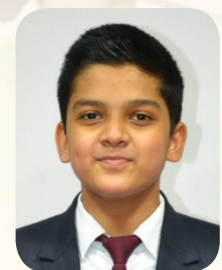


## INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

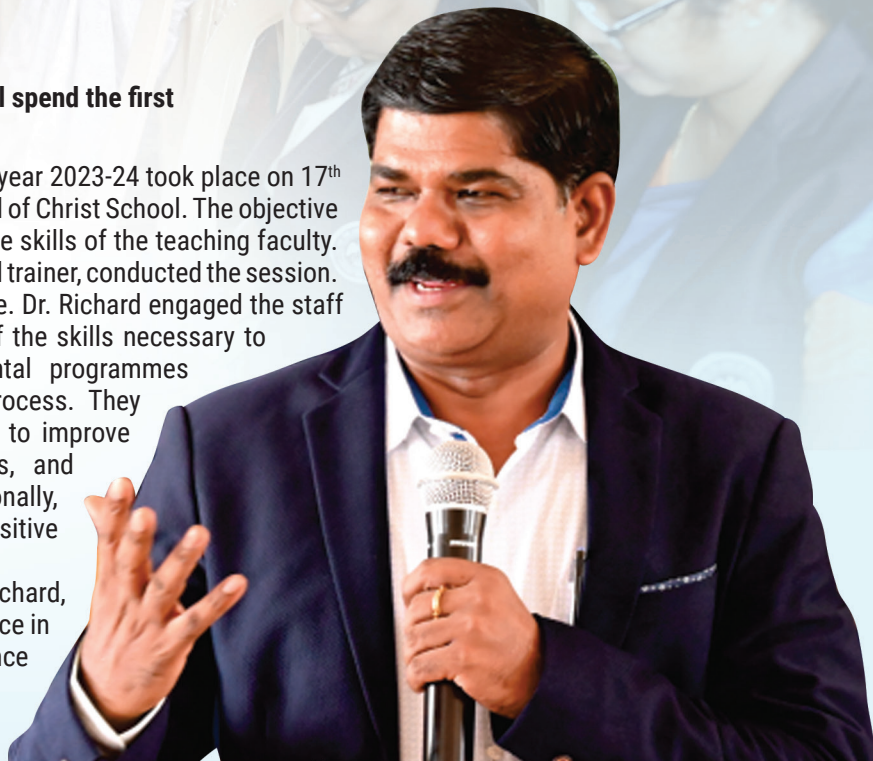
# STAFF UPDATING PROGRAMME

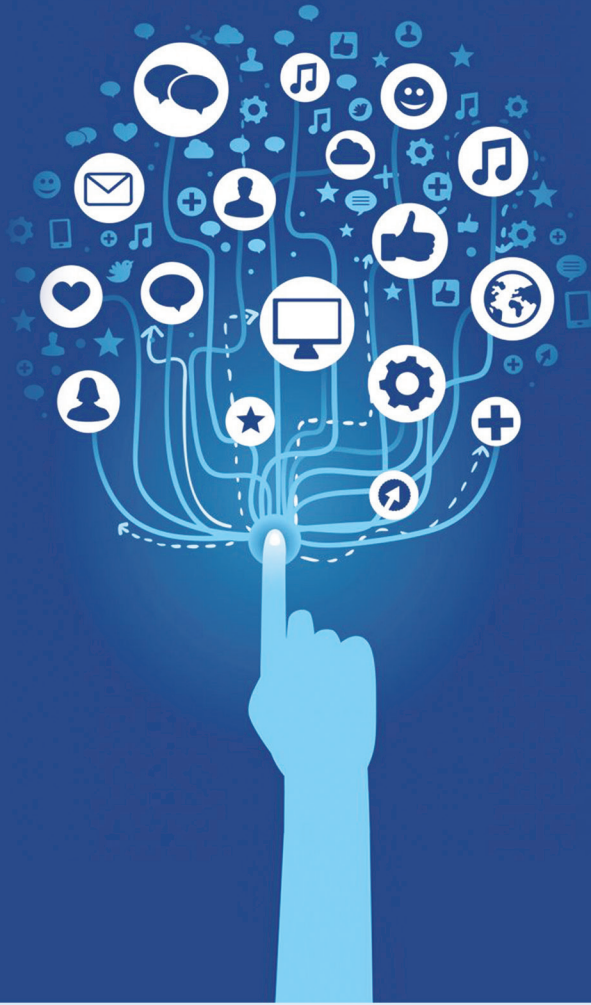
